STEP 1: APPLICATION

- Non-refundable \$50 application fee. *This fee can be waived if it is an excessive financial burden; please do not let it deter you from applying. Call Rebecca Yarmuth to discuss this option.*
- Authorization to Obtain Student Records
- Confirmation of Disclosure

The following materials will be mailed to The Watershed School by the school representative:

- School Representative Questionnaire #1 and #2
These forms should be mailed directly to Watershed School by a teacher or school representative.

STEP 2: INTERVIEW

After reviewing applications, we invite students for an interview at the school.

STEP 3: DECISION

Once we have received all school records and information necessary for a decision, we will contact your family with a decision.

STEP 4: ENROLLMENT

If a student is accepted, your family will receive an enrollment contract with information about next steps.
